The capitalist rulers of Alabama might flog, rape, burn, lynch and starve their darker-skinned subjects from time to time. But they never (No, never!) would lie.

It is therefore especially fitting that these virtuous gentlemen have accused Reverend Martin Luther King of perjury (lying under oath), and are getting him extradited from Atlanta. Georgia back to Montgomery, Alabama, where the "crime" is supposed to have been committed.

What they are really saying is that King absconded with a large amount of money from the Montgomery Improvement Association, and lied about it when he made out his income tax. They are trying to use this to examine the Association's books, find out just who did contribute to the Association, who is a member and so on.

The white supremacist rulers of Alabama are only creating a diversionary smoke-screen behind which they are really trying to attack the civil rights campaign that King is attempting to lead

More Frame-ups Coming

As the struggle develops further in the South, and as more militant leaders come to the fore, the racist rulers will be compelled to use the tactic of frame-up against them, more and more. The racists can no longer successfully attack them for their real "crime"—that is, opposition to racial inequality. Today the racists must resort to sly innuendo, insinuation, and finally, frame-up.

If and when militant leaders of the oppressed show signs of betrayal of their trust, it is the duty of their own organizations to try them, and if guilty, to throw them out.

But the attacks of the ruling class against these leaders are in no way designed to protect the membership from possible dishonesty of the leadership. No, indeed. These attacks are simply to slander and discredit the fighting instruments of the oppressed. They are attacks against the organizations themselves.

In supporting King whole-heartedly against the racist capitalist court he may have to face, we are supporting the Montgomery Improvement Association and its right to exist in defiance of Southern jimcrow justice.

He Loves His Enemies!

Of course King is not the best kind of fighting leader for an embattled organization such as this in the deep South. For example, even at the moment of his arrest, he declared that he had "no bitterness in his heart."

But his persecutors and the persucutors of the MIA are very bitter indeed. They are merciless to any of their slaves who dare to revolt—especially if they only revolt half way. And this incident proves it.

The South needs fighting leaders who are all-the-way fighters—who will not forgive the enemies of the masses until

the masses are free. Therefore, in supporting King, we naturally reserve the right to criticize King's ineffective, pacifist, love-your-enemies method of fighting.

Only relentless prosecution of the class struggle will free the Negro people from their three centuries of bloodand-iron dictatorship—the dictatorship that has now framed-up Martin Luther King.

Tidal Wave of Irresistible Mass Protest Sweeps Over South and Threatens Wall St. Too

Rolling onward like a cataclysmic flood whose waters have gushed from the middle of the earth, the sitdowns have spread from city to city and state to state.

They began by asking for integrated lunchroom service, and are already demanding the larger rights the United States Constitution is supposed to guarantee to everyone.

The flood first welled up in North Carolina when white students enthusiastically supported the Negro students in sitdowns at Woolworth and other Five and Ten's which refused to serve Negroes at the regular lunch counters.

The tide quickly reached into Virginia and even to the arch-reactionary, Confederate-minded state of South Carolina.

Nine cities in North Carolina, three in South Carolina, six in Virginia have been washed by this flood. And the waters of protest have spread to Tennessee and up into Maryland. In the North, Englewood and New Brunswick, New Jersey, Philadelphia, Buffalo and New York City have also felt the storm

The heart and capital of the old slave-owning Confederacy, Montgomery, Alabama, was all but inundated. A thousand students from Alabama State University boldly marched down the main avenue of town to demonstrate at the capitol building.

Defying the white-supremacist Governor Patterson's open threat to expel militant students from the state-supported all-Negro university, they demonstrated not once, but several times in the capitol city.

There were scores of youth arrested both in Virginia and North Carolina. In Raleigh alone, 45 teen-agers were picked up and 28 were fined in Portsmouth. And yet the still more stormy events in Chattanooga and Nashville occurred after these attempted intimidations. The Montgomery mass parade occurred still later, and after the Governor's vicious warning. The movement could not be stopped by ordinary police action!

The Bourbon, bloody-shirt, racist lawmakers of Virginia, Georgia and South Carolina are now busy trying to sweep back the tide with their little brooms—introducing "laws" that say these elemental protests for rights guaranteed a hundred years ago are illegal!

But their efforts will avail them nothing. The aroused Negro people are threatening to tear down the remaining dikes and let the ocean of freedom cover the whole South.

THE GREAT BEGINNING

The South will never be the same again! The tidal wave of sit-downs has introduced a new element into the struggle. Up until now the intervention of the Negro people has been on an isolated and scattered basis. Such was the case even with the bus boycotts. But what is new is the spontaneous intervention of larger masses on the arena of struggle and with an unprecedented boldness and determination.

It is truly the beginning of a mass movement. It differs qualitatively from such a much-acclaimed event as the Supreme Court Desegregation Decision. That was in part an attempt by the ruling class to anticipate the development of just such a dynamic mass movement so as to divert it and tame it with token concessions. But the hard core of the ruling class turned down the advice of its own hand-picked lily-white Court.

As always in the case of "reforms from above" they do no more than delay the inevitable and irresistible historical task that only the masses themselves can carry out.

No farcical filibuster by Dixiecrats in collusion with Northern capitalist politicians can stop it.

White supremacists will try to crush it.

Pacifist preachers will try to disarm it.

Liberal politicians will try to buy it.

Labor bureaucrats will try to curb it.

But through trial and tribulation the mass movement will develop and build up a genuine revolutionary socialist leadership, for only such a leadership can measure up to the great historic task that lies ahead.

British Workers Fight Jimcrow

Over 8,000 London workers demonstrated against South African jimcrow (apartheid) in Trafalgar Square on February 28.

American workers will be interested to learn that this was a nearly all-white demonstration led by the British Labor Party.

A few hundred fascists—similar to American Klansmen and members of the White Citizens Council—tried ineffectively to break the meeting up with an outburst of violence.

The demonstration was held to inaugurate the campaign to boycott South African goods until the "apartheid" laws are repealed.

Anyone who seriously opposes the atomic bomb in the Sahara must oppose United States imperialist-military aid to France.

Polyansky Tells the Truth

Dmitri S. Polyansky, leader of a touring Russian delegation to the United States, made the following statement in Salt Lake City on February 14:

"It is common knowledge that the United Nations is controlled by the United States."

It is quite true that United States capitalism controls the United Nations. But is is most definitely untrue that this is "common knowledge."

In fact, the only reason that Mr. Polyansky even blurted out this unpleasant fact is that some students were baiting him about the UN's censure of the Soviet suppression of the Hungarian uprising of 1956.

The Latin American bloc in the United Nations is entirely controlled-except for Cuba-by the United States. And most West European countries being beneficiaries of United States financial aid, usually vote as the U.S. State Department asks them to.

And what kind of a "United Nations" is it that denies membership to China-one-quarter of the human race?

What Kind of Peace?

There have been 18 limited wars nce the end of the Second World War. Most of these wars have been fought against the rising colonial revolution in Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

Now who was it that said the class struggle was passé?

These facts are concealed by big business however. And they are usually concealed by the Soviet bureaucracy too.

The pacifists, the "world government" advocates, and the members of the Communist Party, all believe, or say they believe, that the United Nations is a genuine congress of countries engaged in making a better world.

But the truth is that the United Nations began as the organization of the victor nations in the Second World War. And their purpose at that time was to insure their victory over the defeated

When the Cold War began, the victorious capitalist nations blocked with the defeated capitalist nations against the Soviet Union. But at no time did the Soviets ever command a majority in the UN even under the best of circum-

Today the United States capitalists run the United Nations with some minor consultations with their junior capitalist partners.

The Soviet Union has a right to belong to this organization if it can derive any benefits from it. But the Soviet bureaucracy has no right to whitewash the United Nations.

Instead, it has the duty to consistently propagate the fact which Polyansky only accidentally revealed - that "the United Nations is controlled by the United

Real Story Behind The Spain-Germany "Axis"

The State Department got into a real stew as a result of its discovery that West Germany and Spain were secretly negotiating an agreement whereby the German air force would obtain bases in Spain for training its missile personnel.

A loud, angry cry came out simultaneously from London and Washington. well-planted State Department and Downing Street newspaper stories immediately got to work with warnings to West Germany and Spain.

But why is Washington so opposed to these two worthy "free world" partners having a little get-together on a military basis of their own?

It is not because of any fear of the rise of a new fascist axis-as the New York Post and other liberal newspapers are telling their readers. Washington and London had no objection against Franco for butchering the Spanish working class, destroying its unions, and imposing the most barbaric form of thought control.

Nor have the financiers and industrialists of Wall Street and Lombard Street any objection to the growing influence of former Nazi generals, ministers, industrialists and bankers in the new re-armed Germany. And in fact they have no objection to military collaboration between a re-armed and re-Nazified Germany and fascist Spain.

What the Anglo-American imperialist partners really objected to in these clandestine military negotiations was something the imperialist press completely blacked out. It was this:

United States finance capital, together with its London junior partner, wants capitalist Germany and fascist Spain to re-arm and collaborate, it's true. But it wants this strictly confined to war plans against the Soviet Union and the East European bloc of workers states!

What Adenauer and Franco were in reality secretly planning was how to re-arm in such a way as to put themselves in a stronger military position to bargain with Britain and the U.S. for imperialist plunder in the world market. This is particularly true of oil-so vitally necessary-which neither Germany nor Spain have, and must purchase at extortionate prices dictated by U.S. and British oil cartels. Spain's strategic position in the Mediterranean makes her an extremely desirable partner to West Germany.

In other words, the Anglo-American financial pirates want Germany and Spain to serve as imperialist satellites in the struggle against the Soviet bloc and colonial people only. And if these partners want to horn in on any of the plunder of the United States and Britain, then that is strictly verboten.

Cheese and Chalk In Civil Rights

(The Case of Caryl Chessman)

The name of Caryl Chessman has blazed across the banner headlines of almost every newspaper in the country, with many sympathetic stories on his behalf.

Now we don't mean to sound hardhearted about an imprisoned man sentenced to die. Quite the contrary. We feel sorry for any victim of circumstances who stands in danger of falling into the clutches of the executioner. We hope Chessman doesn't die.

We doubt however, that the unprecedented publicity by the big business press for his case is motivated by humanitarian sentiments.

We have seen these very same newspapers light-heartedly ignore the imprisonment and death of all too many people, sometimes with hardly any publicity or sympathy at all. So why the uproar about Chessman?

Some years ago, Willie McGee was sentenced to death by a white supremacist court. The all-white jury didn't have a scintilla of evidence before it. But Willie died.

There were no blazing headlines for him. Nor was there a shred of sympathy in the kept press. The same thing happened to Odell Waller several years earlier. When the fair state of Virginia executed the "Martinsville Seven" for alleged rape, it was simply a case of mass murder. But we don't remember any banner headlines on that

And what about the Rosenbergs? They got plenty of publicity, all right -the kind that made their execution

And practically on the same day that Chessman was scheduled to die, Henry Winston, well-known Communist Party leader, was near death as a result of negligence by the U.S. authorities in the prison where he was serving time for no crime at all-except his ideas. There was and still is a virtual blackout of publicity about his case and of course no sympathy from the press.

So again, why the uproar about Chessman? What's really behind it? It's the old boss tactic of putting up a phony issue in order to distract the people from the real one.

The bosses know that cheese and chalk look alike. When it serves their interest, they try to pass off one for the other. That's why it's a good idea to examine them carefuuly -- especially in an election year.

The biggest issue in this country is now and has been for quite a number of years - the witch-hunt - the persecution, oppression and imprisonment of people for their ideas. Now that the political atmosphere seems to be changing, and people are beginning to speak up, the titans of finance and industry who rig the press, radio and TV are badly in need of a new type of political "commercial."

So they want to pass off chalk for cheese in the matter of civil rights. They want to convert the fight against monopoly capital into a fight against capital punishment. That is why they embroider the Chessman case with tears and sympathy while they sew up the Winston case in a blanket of silence.

(The very best argument against capital punishment in the U. S.—that it's mostly applied to Negroes-the capitalists do not even mention.)

Yet there are so-called Socialists who cannot understand what is going on. They give a free plug to this vile political commercial of big business without even getting payola, and dupe their unwary readers in the bargain.

We feel a workers party has a general duty to defend everyone who is persecuted by the capitalist government. However, the cases which the party selects to push, especially in a period of witch-hunt, where there are literally hundreds and thousands of such cases, are of key importance.

But a case like Chessman's is not one of them. It is eminently appropriate material for such venerable organizations as the Salvation Army, the Women's Christian Temperance Union, or the Fellowship of Reconciliation. But not for the working class move-

Steelworkers Begin to Sense A New Wave of Layoffs

The fact that steelworkers are working for the same money they were getting a year ago is obscured for the moment by generally full employment, high incentive and bonus earnings due to record breaking exploitation of labor and considerable overtime work in all departments.

Steelworkers, feel uneasy about the future and the feeling is growing that mass layoffs may be coming in steel by midsummer.

Here in Youngstown the Youngstown Vindicator is now warning the workers not to expect the prosperity to last very long. The Vindicator pretends to be puzzled by the short life of the steel shortage. (When the steelworkers were driven back to work with the Taft-Hartley injunction, the Vindicator predicted steel operations would be at capacity for the whole of 1960.) If there is a crisis approaching, however, the Vindicator explains it all with the stock answer, "Wages are too g—d—high."

This absurd nut-house formulation, so popular among the capitalist press nowadays, doesn't find a mass market among the working class. Even the steelworkers, nearly the highest paid among industrial workers, feel aggrieved about not getting a wage increase, feel they should have more

Royal Babies And Royal Liars

The New York Herald-Tribune greets the birth of a new heir to the Japanese and British thrones with joy and exultation. It said on February 24:

"One of the pleasantest aspects of the news, for us here in the United States, is that we should be able to rejoice equally with friends on opposite sides of the globe, representing what once were the opposite poles of civilization, in the knowledge that both thrones now represent bulwarks of freedom and democracy."

Only fifteen years ago, the *Herald-Tribune* could find no words extreme enough to describe the new baby's grandfather, Emperor Hirohito. And once upon a time, the King of England was considered the worst enemy of humanity by most Americans.

But aside from all this, we should be entitled to ask the question: Since when are *thrones* the "bulwarks of freedom and democracy"?

Thrones are the seats of hereditary monarchs. They are a carry-over from

money and chafe over the enormous bite taken from their pay by taxes.

To propose that they take a wage

cut to reinforce the faltering boom sounds, to them, insane. It is and so is the system they live in. And it has been so since 1914. (But this does not prevent the steel bosses from taking their insanity out on the workers.)

Cutbacks are coming in steel and they will show that the contract has failed to move toward the solution of what will very soon be again the number one problem to the steelworkers—the problem of unemployment.



A Letter on Algeria

In your Spotlight Topic for Monday, February 16, you say, "French enterprise and French capital, 600 million dollars, have made Algeria what it is today—"

In this one phrase you have, probably unconsciously on your part, printed one of the briefest and most thoroughly damning indictments of the imperialism of western capitalism ever written.

We have made Algeria what it is today—this boast which the bankers take so much pride in means something entirely different to the colonial and non-industrialized nations of the world who are the vast majority of mankind.

To these people, Algeria today is a slaughter-house where men are tortured and murdered and women and children sytematically starved. And this river of bloodshed is unleashed to protect the returns on the 600 million dollars. Why No Tomatoes for Ike?

Why is Eisenhower's tour of South America so much more successful than Vice President Nixon's was last year? Is Ike's smile so much more powerful than the smooth talk of "Tricky Dick"? Or does the reason lie a little deeper?

The real reason is that the C. P.'s throughout the world are showing American capitalism how well-behaved they

Khrushchev and the Moscow bureaucracy are so anxious to make "peace" with Eisenhower that they are asking the national CP's to call off the class struggle! When "Ike" visited Italy last fall, for example, the CP criticized the Italian capitalists for not being enthusiastic enough, and it chanted, "We like Ike, too!"

The only demonstrations against the imperialist Eisenhower's triumphal tour of South America were by "left-wing Socialists," Peronists, and student supporters of Castro. The Communist Party was eloquently silent.

All of Latin America is an economic colony of Wall Street imperialism. The Communist Party, although illegal in many Latin American countries, is relatively strong and powerful. This is because the people are so terribly oppressed, and so anxious to throw off their chains.

What the masses need most immediately is to get rid of Yankee domination. Therefore the most natural, thing would be for them to greet Eisenhower with jeers rather than cheers. But with the largest working-class party now hailing him as "sincerely for peace," even some workers innocently joined in the false cry: "Viva Ike!"

But Eisenhower's triumph in South America will be short-lived. On the very morrow of his return to Washington, new struggles will erupt, new leaders will arise. And in spite of all Wall Street's billions, the Latin American masses will fight their oppressors, with or without the aid of the Communist Party.

Since the above was written, we learn that the Trotskyists of Chile organized a great demonstration against Eisenhower. We are glad and proud to hear this and to solidarize ourselves with their action.

We are equally glad to see that Uruguayan students and workers demonstrated so energetically.

ondon Conference Fails to Halt Revoloution in Kenya

The stormy London conference over the political future of Kenya adjourned February 21, with nothing really settled except that the British imperialists were going to play the same twofaced role they have always played with their colonial slaves.

At first it appeared that the Africans attending the conference were taken in by the phony talk of "guarantees" for the protection of property rights."-The British want to write into the proposed Kenya Constitution a legal guarantee for the land holdings_ to stay just as they are now. And the end of the conference was hailed in this country with the following head-"Kenya Talks End in Accord on line : Land."

The truth, it now appears, is just the opposite. There was, in fact, a three-week deadlock on the land question. And no wonder! The land question is the question of liberty or slavery, life or death, for the Africans in Kenya.

One per cent of the population, the white capitalist British, own more than half the arable land—the so-called "White Highlands." This land is among the most beautiful and desirable in the whole world. Some British holdings are as high as 30,000 acres. The Africans have 5.8 acres per capita. And much of their land is worthless.

The African delegation should have understood in the first place that the British were putting on a great masquerade to fool the colonial peoples of the world, including the Kenyans themselves. And the Africans were only aiding the British by their presence.

Jomo Kenyatta, the outstanding Kenva fighter for liberation, is still imprisoned by the British. With Kenyatta still restricted, the Conference could only be a "democratic" fraud: The British refused to seat anyone alleged to be involved in the so-called Mau Mau uprising of 1952.

This was a sharp warning that they have no intention of retreating on any

week deadlock on the land question made this crystal clear to anyone who still dobuted it.

Of course, the British Colonial Office representing the most subtle and sensi-

tive slave masters in the world, 'well understands that some concessions have to be made. Iain McLeod, the Colonial Secretary, talked grandly about the coming "independence" for Kenya, and even promised \$3 million for the maintenance of the East African Land Forces! (This was the "native" army the British used to hunt down the Mau

McLeod also held out the bait of \$14 million for new "development projects" some of which might conceivably help the African people in Kenya.

African leaders are very conscious of the need to develop their country along modern, industrial lines. And they naturally need capital. But as long as the British capitalists have all the best land in the country, they will hold a strangle grip on the whole economy, since it is based on agricul-

when the Africans hold a clear majority in the Kenya Parliament and formally control their own government.

The fact that Africans will gain more formal control is already assured. Sir Patrick Renison, British appointed Governor of Kenya, has informed Mc-Leod that he would like to bring more Africans into his council at once rather than wait until the new Constitution

Why this enlightened liberalism from the oppressors' overseer?

The truth is that the great majority of British capitalists, and even most of those in Kenya itself, are deathly frightened that they will lose everything, unless they make some concessions soon. And they hope that the Africans will accept the form of freedom, while they, the British, keep the essence for themselves.

The United Party of Kenya which gets a lot of publicity as the stand-pat super-colonialist organ of the white capitalists, now appears doomed. But this is not because the imperialists have grown less vicious or more kind. It is because new times require more subtle methods of rule.

The White Kenya capitalists have a new party now - the New Kenya Group. This party says it wants more black representation in the Kenya Parliament. It is led by smart capitalist opportunists who scent the coming wind of black freedom. Their plan for gradual parliamentary freedom is full of duplicity and booby traps. But it was more or less victorious at the Conference. And it was not really fought by the Africans.

Michael Blundell, leader of the New Kenya Group, in fact hailed the whole conference as "a victory for modera-

He said he had no fears for the future of the white capitalist community in Kenya.

Blundell did not miss the fact that the African delegation repudiated the

aware of the conciliatory nature of some of the Africans present. And he saw the African delegation pledge itself to an "independent judiciary." (This means that judges shall not be controlled by the African majority.)

But the fact remains that the Africans. would not consent to any British property guarantees being written into the new constitution. This means that no matter how soft, how conciliatory, how legal-minded they are, the African leaders will still respond to the African masses. They will have to fight for the end of the British ownership of the "White Highlands."


The upheaval in Kenya will continue. The legal and parliamentary changes in the coming year will only be the curtain-raiser to greater changes and more thoroughgoing revolution.

Man of Struggle

Frederick Douglass, one of America's unsung heroes, broke from the chains of slavery and became an abolitionist and liberator of his people. He was a great lecturer and newspaper editor. He fought tirelessly for women's rights and labor solidarity. He believed that while man was in chains no man was

Born in slavery in 1817, he escaped at an early age and fled to the North. In his lecture tours, his life was always at stake. He was beaten up several times and almost killed.

He is the author of the famous

statement:

"If there is no struggle, there is no progress. Those who profess to favor freedom, and yet depreciate agitation are men who want crops without plowing up the ground. They want rain without thunder and lightning. They want the ocean without the awful roar of its many waters. This struggle may be a moral one; or it may be a physical one; or it may be both moral and physical; but it must be a struggle."

Couldn't Happen To a Nicer Gorilla

A call for help is now going out to the zoological societies of the world. It seems that 350 mountain gorillas, the only ones left out of captivity, are in danger of extinction because the Watusis-of the Belgian Congo-are taking over the gorillas' grazing lands for their cattle.

130 Attend WW Public Meeting

Ancient Schools In Modern N. Y. C.!

The walls of an 84-year-old New York City school collapsed last month. Bricks cascaded down on two classrooms. Fortunately there were no children in school since the schools were closed for a holiday.

How did such a near-tragedy come

Schools are factories which prepare workers. Workers have to know how to

read, write and subtract simple sums in order to be any use to the bosses. The bosses regard the trained worker as a product like any other product. But the bosses can't make any money on the schoolchild stage of this product. In fact, they have to chip in a little of their profits to keep these workerpreparation factories going. And they don't like the idea. They'd rather have the workers pay for the whole thing. There are plenty of workers these

days anyway, and more coming. And the bosses are figuring out more and more machines to make a lot of these workers unnecessary. New school buildings for workers' kids aren't so important for the bosses.

If you take all the bosses together, of course, and consider the threat to their system posed by the competition of Soviet science, you'd think schools would be very important to them indeed. But you'd be wrong. They're looking for a buck right now. And they don't want to pay taxes for more edu-

The bosses' factories are replaced when they get old. Their banks are new-and made of marble at that. But schools for workers' kids? Anything will do for them as long as it doesn't cost the bosses money. (They themselves, of course, live out in the sub-urbs and they can afford plenty of new schools out there.)

This may help explain why New York kids were still using that 84-yearold school building which collapsed on Lincoln's birthday.
